

OUT OF SIGHT

Out of Sight is a photojournalistic project which becomes also an emotional and scientific path. The exhibition, that exhibits some pictures of the photojournalist Nanni Fontana, is enriched by articles, infographics and epidemiological, morphological, pharmacoeconomic informations, also on prevention.

Out of Sight has concerned, between 2011 and 2013, five countries: Thailand, Mozambique, Brazil, Ukraine and USA. In each country one or more relevant and representative aspects of the current state of the epidemic were investigated and deepened; it still affects 36 million people, of which about 67% live in sub-Saharan Africa. Only in 2012 there were 2.3 million new infections, more than 4,000 just in Italy, where an HIV-positive person in four doesn't know it.

In line with the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) signed in September 2000 by 191 Chiefs of Staff and Government, the project 'Out of Sight' operates in the context of the objective of number 6, to "stop by 2015, reversing the trend, the spread of HIV / AIDS and to achieve universal access to treatment for HIV / AIDS for all those who need it." The art project by Nanni Fontana, exhibited in Milan, is addressed to everyone, young people and adults, to inform and breed them with a scientific and journalistic approach.
