They, in fact, are able to automatically respond to positive and negative emotions of others, such as excitement, quietness, fear or anger.

## Giulio Calegari – FUGACI UMANE TRACCE (TRANSIENT HUMAN TRACES)

Like the ephemeral potential of a match, the remains of a fire recall the presence of man, his path, sometimes dramatic.
